### ANIMAL RELOCATION PROGRAM

When epic and historic floods deluged Kentucky in the summer of 2022, we knew that animals, like so many humans, would not be spared and they weren't. Untold animals were rendered homeless by the floods. Committed to doing everything possible to help, we organized a disaster assistance plan centered around transporting 26 cats from over-crowded shelters to Massachusetts, where they soon found loving homes. Our teams also provided desperately needed relief help for overworked Kentucky animal shelter employees, many of whom were directly impacted by the storms.

Rosie, an 11-year-old Jack Russell Terrier came to NEAS from a hoarding situation in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Upon arrival it was clear Rosie was in need of medical care as her mouth was very painful. Rosie was able to receive a major dental surgery at Angell Animal Medical Center and is now living her best life with her new family.

## COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Our Community Outreach team met Lucky when his owner came to the shelter looking for affordable resources — they set him up with a low cost neuter surgery, and free pet food from our community pet food bank. Unsure what to do, Lucky's dad called the Community Outreach team right away, and they were able to get Lucky seen at the MSPCA Boston Community Clinic where his wounds were treated.
