- ◆ Hold a **bake sale/lemonade stand or car wash** at the shelter or off-site: We can set up a table outside the shelter on nice weekend days or you can choose your own location. Kids can bring baked items, refreshments, crafts that they have prepared for sale. The money raised can be donated to the animals.
- ◆ Collect any of the items on our **wishlist** to donate to the animals.
- ◆ Make **dog popsicles**. Freeze chicken broth, beef broth, or just plain water in a Tupperware container. Feel free to add toys, milk bones, etc. We give the ice block to the dogs!
- ◆ Help **raise awareness**. Create posters to hang up around your community encouraging people to adopt from our shelter or to promote one of our animals. Hang them at camp, school, church or sporting events. Promote our pets on Facebook, Instagram, or other **social media** sites. - ◆ Feeling generous? **Substitute birthday or holiday gifts** for needed items for the animals. Ask each guest to bring an item to donate to the animals at our adoption center.
