On Monday, November 7th, the MSPCA Cape Cod officially broke ground to begin building the new Animal Care & Adoption Center in Centerville. This exciting milestone was precipitated when we reached the midway point in the \$5 million Campaign for Cape Cod. More than 70 supporters joined the celebration and all of Cape Cod's print, online and broadcast media took note!

A project several years in the making entered a new stage Monday morning, with the groundbreaking of the new MSPCA Adoption Center on Route 28 in Centerville.

Designed to increase the number of animals housed and adopted, and allow the organization to expand its programs for pet owners, the new building will replace the cramped shelter that has served as the MSPCA's home on Cape Cod for nearly 50 years.

"We just couldn't be happier," MSPCA-Angell President and Sandwich resident Carter Luke told a crowd of supporters shortly before the shovels hit the dirt. "We can't thank you enough. This doesn't happen without the community saying 'we want this.'"
